We do this through: -

- One to one advocacy
- Positively encouraging self-advocacy and promoting people with learning disabilities as leaders.
- Raising awareness among groups and individuals in the community about the issues affecting people with a learning disability.
- Offering people with learning disabilities paid and voluntary roles within our organisation.
- Empowering people with learning disabilities to bring about positive change in services, and in the community.

Advocacy in Greenwich has been working with people with learning disabilities in the Royal Borough of Greenwich for the past 25 years. We have well established networks within the local community and the voluntary and statutory sectors. We share communal work spaces and meeting rooms with the Volunteers Centre, Metro and Metro GAVS, the borough's CVS, the forming an Equalities Community Hub. Advocacy in Greenwich has achieved the National Quality Performance Mark three times

The Director will be leading a committed and experienced staff team supporting projects providing over 20 paid opportunities for people with learning disabilities within the organisation.
