The London Forum is for **self advocates** with a learning disability who live in any of the 32 London Boroughs to come together and have their say.



It is a chance to **have a say** about important things and hear what is happening in other boroughs.



The London Forum is chaired by 2 people with a learning disability who were **elected by the Forum members**.



The London Forum used to feed into the National Forum. Now it is funded by NHS England and London ADASS and your co chairs feed back to the **London Learning Disability and Autism Strategic Partnership Board**.

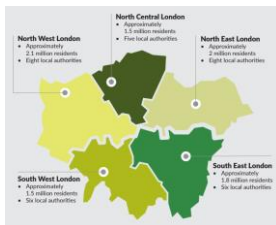
What is the London Learning Disability and Autism Strategic Partnership Board?



The London Learning Disability and Autism Strategic Partnership Board meets **4 times a year.**



The London Partnership Board is chaired by bosses from **NHS England and London ADASS** (Association of Directors of Adult Social Services).



Bosses from each **London Integrated Care System (ICS)** come to the meeting. There are 5 ICS's in London.



Other professionals from **health and social care organisations** come to the meeting (like the Care Quality Commission)



The co chairs of the London Forum take it in turns to go to the London Partnership Board meeting and tell them **what is said at the London Forum.**
